NEWS FROM THE LODGE SECRETARY

While the calendar year 2018 has ended, the Lodge year for 2018-19 has not. In fact, it will not close until March 31, 2019. That does not mean we have not started to gear up for the close of our year. We measure the success of the year in several different ways, one being membership. As the old saying goes, I have good news and bad news. Our membership stands at 675, an increase of 17 since April 1 or a 2.6% rate of growth. This compares to a rate of 3.6% nationwide. In addition, we have 15 candidates eligible for initiation on January 17. Unfortunately, this has to be balanced against the fact that we still have 57 members who have not paid dues this year, or 8.4% of the current membership. Nationwide, the Elks report a delinquency rate of 9.9%. We plan to contact all those who remain delinquent in dues payments. If you are one of those who has not paid dues for this year and you are thinking about leaving the Lodge, we would certainly like to know why you have made this decision.
